NATASHA GREENBLATT - CO-CREATOR & PERFORMER

Natasha Greenblatt is a writer, performer, educator, and the co-artistic director of Two Birds Theatre. Selected acting credits include: Audrey Dwyer's Calpurnia (Nightwood/b current), Alice Through the Looking Glass (NAC and Charlottetown Festival) and Jordan Tannahill's Get Yourself Home Skyler James (Roseneath, Dora Award). Her plays include The Peace Maker (Next Stage Festival, Playwrights Canada Press), Two Birds One Stone, written and performed with Rimah Jabr (Riser Project, Tarragon Workspace, Impact Festival, and the Winnipeg Jewish Theatre) and The Election, a play she wrote with Yolanda Bonnell (Common Boots Theatre, Nightwood Theatre, Theatre PasseMuraille, and Theatre Direct).

Natasha is currently an MFA candidate in Creative Writing at the University of Guelph.



Kate Lushington - Co-creator & Performer

Kate Lushington "is always a political artist…a pioneering theatre creator since the 1970's" wrote late beloved critic Jon Kaplan in SummerWorks Artists to Watch 2011. Directing highlights include My Name is Rachel Corrie at Tarragon Extra Space & Your Dream was Mine by Shirley & Greta Cheechoo, both designed by Astrid Janson, and A Fertile Imagination by Susan G. Cole. Kate's play Up Against the Wallpaper cowritten with feminist lip synch troupe The Clichettes was a 1988 hit for Nightwood Theatre; she subsequently served six seasons there as Artistic Director. Her 10-minute film Subway Transfer about a baby exchanged between strangers on the TTC won the Mouche D'Or at the

On the Fly Festival, and her CBC Radio adaptation of Josef Skvorecky's The Bass Saxophone won a Nellie. Easy Money created with injured workers was shown at the Mayworks Festival and she is currently developing DSM: The Musical by Kerry Westell from Workman Arts. Formerly a member of PAND (Performing Artists for Nuclear Disarmament) she now supports SCAN! (Seniors for Climate Action Now!)



ahdri zhina mandiela - director

since the late 70's ahdri zhina mandiela has worked as a performance poet with readings, performances, lectures, and workshops around the world. she's the founder and past artistic director of the legendary b current performing arts in toronto, canada. her work in artistic mentoring and training, and as dramaturg or director of countless play scripts, performance pieces, mainstage and touring productions has profoundly influenced new and seasoned artists across canada and beyond. mandiela's current artistic push includes developing a large-scale multiarts project (my world.a village), a new playscript called fly with factory theatre in toronto, amplifying the voices of young folx in black stage

canada, developing speak! as alternative arts training for students at canada's national theatre school, and directing theatre shows for companies in toronto and montreal.



Astrid Janson – Production Designer

Astrid Janson's production design work for theatre, dance, opera and film, has been seen on stages across Canada, from the Arts and Culture Centre in Newfoundland, to the Pacific Opera in BC. Canadian theatres include the Stratford Festival, Soulpepper Theatre, The Canadian Opera Co., Canadian Stage, Citadel Theatre, The National Ballet, the National Arts Centre, and most Toronto Theatres, and 15 plays for Videocabaret, including the costumes for 13 of Michael Hollingsworth's award winning History Plays. Her television career includes award winning films, specials and series. Civic projects include the exhibitions for the Ontario Pavilion at Expo '86 and a new Discovery Gallery for the ROM. She has been

recognized with numerous honours for her design work including the Silver Ticket Award for Lifetime Achievement in the Theatre, and an Honorary Doctorate from Wilfrid Laurier University.



Alejandra Nuñez - Sound Designer

Alejandra Nuñez is a vocalist, percussionist, composer and mother to Natalia and Mathew, who holds a Masters in Theatre Studies from York University. Born in Santiago Chile, Alejandra has lived and worked as a musician in Canada and the United States, she has performed in Europe as well as North and Central America. Her training on percussion has taken her to Brazil, Cuba, Puerto Rico, New York and Egypt. She is the band leader of Latin Jazz Band Projecto Urbano Self titled CD with Mano Music. Alejandra has performed with The Toronto Dance Theatre and written scores for various plays, including Djanet Sears' *Adventures of A Black Girl in Search of God* (Dora Mayor Moore Award Nomination –

Musical Direction). Other highlights include musical direction for the Mirvish production of Trey Anthony's *Da Kink in My Hair*, and musical direction and soundscape for Michael Miller's *The Power of Harriet T?* at Young People's Theatre, Anne-Marie Woods' *Scotian Journey* and Trey Anthony's *How Black Mothers Say I Love You*, both for Black Theatre Workshop in Montreal.



Dylan Tate-Howarth – Production Stage Manager

Dylan Tate-Howarth is a theatre artist based in Toronto, working primarily as a stage manager for new and/or devised plays. Selected stage management credits include *Two Birds One Stone* (Two Birds Theatre), *Flashing Lights, Italian Mime Suicide, Paolozzapedia* (Bad New Days) and *Our Fathers, Sons, Lovers and Little Brothers* (b current Performing Arts). She has also worked as a production manager with The AMY Project and Jumblies Theatre. Dylan is a co-creator of Probably Theatre Collective and co-curator of Probably Poetry.



Abby Esteireiro – Assistant Designer

Abby Esteireiro (she/her) is a theatre maker and designer based in Toronto. She is a part of All Day I Dream About...Theatre, a theatre and film group which premiered *What Are You Supposed To Be?* at the 2021 Toronto Fringe Festival. Recently, Abby and company won the University of Toronto Drama Coalition 2020-2021 Award for Best Play, Best Production Design, and Best Set Design for their production of *Porcelain Tigers*. In 2019, she showcased her work at the Canadian Student Exhibition at the Prague Quadrennial of Performance Design and Space.

Elaine Zhang – Apprentice Producer & Dance Wrangler

Elaine Zhang is a hip hop and open choreography based dancer born and raised in Vancouver, BC. Since moving to Toronto in 2017, she has trained at Dark Dance Company, FLUX Competitive Dance Team, and theTEAM. With over 35 experiences in teaching, directing, and performing dance, Elaine is excited to step into a new field and learn about the theatre community in Toronto. Through her U of T Women and Gender Studies course taught by Professor Judith Taylor, Elaine joined Two Birds Theatre Company as a research intern developing an in depth outreach survey for their upcoming production. In her current position, she brings her experience as the former director of FLUX to helping

organize a successful Apocalypse Play.



Alice Norton - Wigs - Cut & Style

Alice has worked in the Trinidadian carnival tradition, and in theatre spectacles with Shadowland and Jumblies Theatre among many others; since 2003 she has made wigs for VideoCabaret, especially the epic play series History of the Village of the Small Huts, garnering many Dora awards over a long and illustrious career. She owns and operates her own hair salon, The House of Big Hair, on Toronto Island.



Charlotte Corbeil-Coleman – Dramaturgy

Charlotte's most recent play *Guarded Girls* (Tarragon Theatre, Green Light Arts) won the Dora Mavor Moore Award for Outstanding New Play and was nominated for a Governor General Award. Winner of The Herman Voaden National Playwriting Award, and The K.M. Hunter Artist Award, she is a graduate of the playwriting program at the National Theatre School of Canada. Selected credits include: The End of Pretending (SummerWorks, Regent Theatre), Scratch (Factory Theatre, La Licorne, Theatre Plexus, Off-Broadway Players), Sudden Death (Next Stage), Twisted with Joseph Jomo Pierre (Factory Theatre). Charlotte directed and co-created Highway 63: The Fort Mac Show (Architect Theatre, TPM).

She wrote for CBC Radio's *Afganada*, the TV series *KING* (Showcase) and *Safehaven* (Crackle). As dramaturg: *This Must Be the Place* (Architect Theatre/TPM), *Unknown Soldier* by Jonathan Seinen (SummerWorks), *Two Birds One Stone* by Natasha Greenblatt and Rimah Jabr, (Tarragon Workspace). *Iphigenia and the Furies on Taurian Land* by Ho Ka Kei (Saga Collectif).

Monique Mojica – Embodied Dramaturgy & Talk Back Panelist

Monique (Guna and Rappahannock nations) is an actor, director,
playwright and teacher, passionately dedicated to a theatrical practice as
an act of healing, reclaiming historical/cultural memory and resistance.

Spun directly from the family-web of New York's Spiderwoman Theater,
founded by her mother and two aunts, her theatrical practice embraces
not only her artistic lineage through mining stories embedded in the body,
but also the connection to stories coming through land and place. She
has given embodied performance workshops throughout Canada, the
U.S., Latin America and Europe. Monique came to Toronto as Artistic
Director of Native Earth in 1983. Her first play *Princess Pocahontas and*

the Blue Spots was produced in 1990 under Kate Lushington's mentorship at Nightwood Theatre. She was co-founder of Turtle Gals Performance Ensemble with whom she created The Scrubbing Project, the Dora-nominated The Triple Truth and The Only Good Indian. Recent work includes Aunt Shady in Marie Clements' The Unnatural and Accidental Women (NAC), touring I lost My Talk (NAC Orchestra), writing and performing Izzie M.: The Alchemy of Enfreakment, and dramaturg for Kaha:wi Dance Theatre's Sken:en. She is dramaturg for Ayita, a new work by Teneil Whiskeyjack premiering at Edmonton's SkirtsAfire Festival in March 2022.

TWO BIRDS THEATRE

Two Birds Theatre was co-founded in 2016 by Jewish-Canadian theatre maker Natasha Greenblatt and Palestinian theatre maker Rimah Jabr to explore collaboration across difference. Their inaugural project Two Birds One Stone had sold out runs at the Riser Project and Tarragon Theatre's Workspace, with tours to Impact Festival in Kitchener, the Winnipeg Jewish Theatre and In The Soil Festival in St. Catharines (digital performance). Apocalypse Play is our second production, this time with a focus on collaboration across generations. This is reflected not only on stage, but in the intergenerational company of artists who worked to create this production.

COMMON BOOTS THEATRE

Common Boots Theatre is one of over 250 professional performing arts organizations in the city of Toronto. It is part of a vibrant group of independent theatres that create collaborativelydevised theatre for specific spaces, and one of only a few whose works feature women as central characters with a focus on "serious comedy".

Since 1983 Common Boots has created over 40 original works, been honoured with 53 nominations and 10 Dora Mavor Moore Awards; a Chalmers Best Canadian Play Award for The Betrayal, as well as nominations for Dr Dapertutto and The Attic, The Pearls & 3 Fine Girls. Our recent annual activities have included outdoor winter productions, site specific audio led production (Scadding), and new works for the traditional theatrical environment (The Public Servant and The Election).

During the pandemic, Common Boots partnered with BALANCE for Blind Adults to create a series of community engagement workshops and audio based online events called THE LISTENING STAGE. We supported The Globe Theatre's audio recording of *The Story* (created and premiered as outdoor winter theatre by Common Boots), the digital iteration of May I take your Arm? in co-production with Theatre PasseMuraille & RedDress Productions and, the short film Postcards from my Balcony. In development is a new play, Perceptual Archaeology based on the blind travel writings of Alex Bulmer. www.commonbootstheatre.ca
