# A Note from the Company

Outside a window is a forest. You have an urge to go there, to walk through its twisty darkness. You have no idea what you will find. It could be dangerous to the point of being deadly; it could be idyllic, you might find a paradise. You go because you feel like you have no choice - almost as if you are a character in a fairy tale and it's your destiny, it's your mythological duty.

Our story has no villains and no saints. Our characters are trying to understand love. Some of us stop being compelled by the forest and then some of us never stop. Who is to say which choice is virtuous, which is not? We welcome you to our tangled tales that we have created over the past four years. It is a difficult subject but a rich subject. We welcome you to our forest.

The Betrayal was last workshopped at the Theatre Centre West in 1996. It has been collectively created over a period of four years, through a process involving improvisation, writing and many hours of discussion.

#### **Theatre Columbus Mandate**

Theatre Columbus' primary focus is to create original shows combining a physical theatre tradition with issues relevant to our time and place.

Over the past 14 years, Theatre Columbus has collaborated with a variety of artists with diverse backgrounds and training, but who have an understanding and appreciation for the style of our work. We are oriented toward the actor and tend to build on the performance skills of those involved. Our plays are primarily comedies, although in varying degrees they reveal a tragic edge, an edge which has become a vital component of our comic style. It is through the investigation of the relationship between laughter and pathos that we create worlds which, no matter how fantastical, are always rigourously attentive to the full range of human experience.

Melissa Berney (Stage Manager): Melissa last worked with Theatre Columbus ASMing The Barber Of Seville. She is also the Stage Manager of the Daniel Brook's directed Possible Worlds (Possible Worlds Co. and Theatre Passe Muraille). Other recent work: SM of Insomnia (Augusta Company) and The Travelling Troupe Shopalovich (Equity Showcase), ASM of The Little Years (Theatre Passe Muraille) and Skinny Saints (Skinny Saints Co.,) Assistant Volunteer Co-ordinator for the 17th Annual Genie Awards. Upcoming: SM of a new work by Karen Hines, directed by Chris Earle, to be presented in April at the Dupont St. Studio, then off to Quebec City as Possible Worlds lives again at the Carrefour Festival in May.

Leah Cherniak (Director): is Co-founder and Co-artistic Director with Martha Ross of Theatre Columbus. She directs, acts in and co-creates shows for the company, including The Barber Of Seville, Still, The Knee Plays I & Ii, and Ratbag. Leah directed and co-wrote The Anger In Ernest And Ernestine, which was published in 1990 and has been performed in theatres across the country. She has worked with a variety of theatres across Canada, including The Diary Of Anne Frank for Young People's Theatre. In 1992 she received the Pauline McGibbon Award for Directing. She also teaches clown at the National Theatre School in Montreal. This season she played Jelly in The Attic, The Pearls & 3 Fine Girls at G.C.T.C. in Ottawa. Upcoming: directing The Cherry Orchard with Dean Gilmour in a co-production with Theatre Smith-Gilmour.

Oliver Dennis (Actor): Past Theatre Columbus credits include Knee Plays I, 1492, The Porch People, Dr. Dapertutto and Sir Andrew Aguecheek in Twelfth Night. Other theatre credits include Vigil (N.A.C./Grand Theatre), Touchstone in As You Like It (Festival of Classics, Oakville), Great Expectations and Dracula (The Grand Theatre, London), The Importance Of Being Ernest and A Christmas Carol (Theatre New Brunswick), Yankee Notions and I'll Be Back Before Midnight (Blyth Festival), Demetrius in A Midsummers' Night's Dream, Dora nomination for Bob in Mirror Game (YPT). Other Toronto stages: Factory Theatre, Theatre Passe Muraille, Canadian Stage, Solar Stage. TV credits include Traders, Taking The Falls and Love And Hate.

Maggie Huculak (Actor): Maggie Huculak's association with Theatre Columbus dates back to 1989 with Doctor Dapertutto. Her stage credits include Beating Heart Cadaver (Necessary Angel), Three Tall Women (Grand Theatre), Seven Lears and Edmund in King Lear (Necessary Angel), The Little Years, Body And Soul and Under The Skin (Theatre Passe Muraille), Play Murder (Buddies in Bad Times), Lion In The Streets (Tarragon Theatre) Escape From Happiness (Factory Theatre), The Knee Plays and Twelfth Night for Theatre Columbus, The Doctor's Dilemma (Shaw Festival) and Julia in Two Gentlemen Of Verona (The Stratford Festival). Shauna Janssen (Assistant Stage Manager): Shauna is thrilled to be working with Theatre Columbus again. Upcoming projects include Anne at YPT and You Can't Take It With You at the Shaw Festival. Sue is winner of several Doras, a member of Associated Designers of Canada and lives in Toronto with her exasperated partner and two children.

Andrea Lundy (Lighting Design): Andrea continues a long relationship with Theatre Columbus, having production managed many of their shows and designed The Attic, The Pearls & 3 Fine Girls, The Barber Of Seville, Knee Plays I And II and Twelfth Night. She has won 3 Dora awards, for Attic, for Theatre Passe Muraille's Possible Worlds and for Die in Debt's Oedipus. Other design credits include Tarragon's The Designated Mourner and The Retreat, Modern Times' August 22nd, Theatre Passe Muraille's Still the Night, Platform 9's Gulag (Dora nomination) and Eddycandyside, Da Da Kamera's Here Lies Henry (Dora nomination) and The Augusta Company's Red Tape and The Lorca Play (Dora nomination). She is currently the Production Manager at Tarragon Theatre. Upcoming: Megatropolis for Die in Debt and The Cherry Orchard for Theatre Columbus

Cathy Nosaty (Music & Sound Design): Cathy Nosaty did original music and sound for the workshop production of *The Betrayal*, and is pleased to return to the project as part of the creative team. She was remount sound designer for *The Attic, The Pearls & 3 Fine Girls* last spring and for the recent production at Great Canadian Theatre Company. She will return to GCTC later this season as sound designer for the premiere production of *Pauline And Turgenyev*. Other recent productions include *Random Acts* for Nightwood Theatre and *Old Friends*, a Ronnie Burkett Theatre of Marionettes and Manitoba Theatre for Young People co-production.

Martha Ross (Actor): Martha Ross is Co-artistic Director and Co-founder of Theatre Columbus with Leah Cherniak. Since 1983 she has been performing and writing for the company, her most recent performance was a GCTC production of the Theatre Columbus hit comedy, The Attic, the Pearls & 3 Fine Girls. Her writing credits include: Ratbag (with music composed by John Millard), the award winning Paranoia (written in collaboration with the company), and Dr. Dapertutto which was nominated for a Floyd S. Chalmers Best Play Award. In 1987 Martha collectively created (with Leah Cherniak and Robert Morgan) The Anger In Ernest & Ernestine. She is currently writing another musical with John Millard about three Canadians in a snow storm. Upcoming: the Theatre Columbus/Theatre Smith-Gilmour coproduction of The Cherry Orchard.

Banuta Rubess (Script Consultant): Banuta Rubess is an award-winning playwright and director. Her most recent production was the comedy hit Froth-The Shopping Show. Other plays include Head In A Bag, Boom, Baby, Boom and Pope Joan. She devised and guest produced the CBC radio show Adventure Stories For (Big) Girls. She last directed Leah and Martha for the Theatre Columbus production Still. She is Co-artistic co-director of Froth Productions.

Michael Simpson (Actor): Michael Simpson has appeared in many Theatre Columbus shows including Melancholia, Paranoia, Dr. Dapertutto, Twelfth Night and the Peer Gynt workshop. Last summer he played Jacques in Albert Schultz's As You Like It. At Montreal's Centaur Theatre he starred in VIGIL. He was a Stratford member for three years where he performed Launce in Two Gentlemen Of Verona and Snout in A Midsummers Night's Dream. Michael received a Dora Award for his work in Paranoia and received a Best Actor's Dora nomination for his Tusenbach in Three Sisters. Lately, Michael has been thrilling audiences south of the border, playing D.J. in A Child's Christmas In Wales and Mr. Rice in Molly Sweeney at the Irish Classical Theatre of Buffalo.
