NOTE FROM THE WRITER, MARTHA ROSS

Twenty-five years ago, Leah and I began to create physical theatre that has its own unique comic style, a style in which there's always the presence of something serious or sad, even tragic. For most of our original creations, we begin with a theme. Themes about anger, paranoia, doubt, familial tension, loneliness, and so on.

Before I wrote And Up They Flew, we began with an exploration period with actors and the theme of flight. We improvised countless situations of packing, escaping and fleeing. We delved into our dreams of flying and imitated many a bird. And we explored gravity and those moments when you can't leave the earth, a room or a situation.

It was decided that I would write a play, using our exploration of flight as inspiration. The physical energy of fleeing led me to writing a farce-like comedy. It became apparent to me that I wanted to set this comedy between the wars, a time in history that has always interested me, as it tells us so much about the origins of our current tensions, globally and individually.

The comic style that fuels **And Up they Flew** is consistent with our past shows; we look for the emotional truth of the characters while embracing a heightened sense of play. The characters are all caught in their various tensions and emotional quagmires of denial, self-deception, and paralysis. They are all struggling with their own predicaments of being trapped. Our ongoing search with this play is to find the lightness in the gravity, and the gravity in the lightness. The true essence of theatre is for us, exactly that, it is about the actor and the actors' joy of play. It is about the joy of playing the truth.

I would like to thank my parents, Marion and Donald Ross, for their inspiration and their tireless dedication to the peace movement since the late forties.

And Up They Flew will be published April 2009 by Scirocco Drama.

BIOGRAPHIES

LEAH CHERNIAK: DIRECTOR & CO-ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Leah Cherniak is the Co-Artistic Director with Martha Ross of Theatre Columbus in Toronto. She studied theatre at Ecole Jacques Lecoq in Paris. For Theatre Columbus she has directed most of the company's repertoire, including the multi-award winning published play, The Anger in Ernest & Ernestine, which has been produced all over the world, including Labrador, Cuba, Czechoslovakia and Los Angeles. Also much loved are the collaborative plays the company has produced such as Paranoia, Still, Lonely Nights, The Betrayal, Hotel Loopy, Dance of the Red Skirts and many many more. Leah also loved the Theatre Columbus adaptations such as The Barber of Seville, Gynty and John Gabriel Borkman. She created and played the role of Jelly in The Attic, The Pearls & 3 Fine Girls. Leah also directs for other theatres across the country. Some highlights include Michel Tremblay's Past Perfect, John and Beatrice, by Carol Frechette and Michael Healey's Rune Arlidge at The Tarragon; John Mighton's The Little Years, a co-production between Neptune Theatre and The National Arts Centre. Recently she directed I Claudia by Kristen Thomson at The Saidye Bronfman

Centre in Montreal and Samuel Beckett's Happy Days at The National Arts Centre in Ottawa. Leah teaches an intensive clown course for The Ryerson Theatre Program. She also teaches for other major institutions, including York University, University of Toronto and The National Theatre School.

MARTHA ROSS: WRITER & CO-ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Martha Ross co-founded Theatre Columbus with Leah Cherniak after she graduated from Ecole Jacques Lecoq in Paris. Continuing in the spirit of their training, their company has created twenty-eight original comedies, including the world renowned The Anger in Ernest & Ernestine (1987); The Attic, the Pearls & 3 Fine Girls (1995), for which she received a Dora Mavor Moore award for her performance; and The Betrayal, which received a 1999 Chalmers Award for Best New Play. Most recently Martha performed in Manon Beaudoin's play, Queen of Hearts. As well as performing, Martha has written several plays, including, Dr. Dapertutto (nominated for the Floyd S. Chalmers Best New Play award in 1990); Ratbag, a musical about the Industrial Revolution, which she wrote with her composer husband, John Millard; and The Dog and the Angel for the Caravan Farm Theatre Co. She currently has several writing projects flying around in her head.

PAUL BRAUNSTEIN: MARLOW STOKES

Paul has worked in theatre, film, television and radio across Canada. Some favourite credits include Picasso in Picasso at the Lapin Agile (Belfry/Alberta Theatre Projects), Dick Dudgeon in The Devil's Disciple at the Neptune Theatre, Kilt, Midnight Sun & Alias Godot (Tarragon Theatre), Bill Sykes in Michael O'Brien's adaptation of Oliver Twist at Alberta Theatre Projects, The Overcoat at the World Stage Festival, Grumio in The Taming of the Shrew (Shakespeare-Works) and Jesus of Nazareth in The Last Days of Judas Iscariot (Birdland Theatre).

Paul recently spent three seasons on **Train 48** as Johnny McLaughlin. Paul is also a professional drummer.
