
# THE STORY by Martha Ross

IN DEVELOPMENT: The Election

During the federal election of 2015, Jennifer Brewin enlisted Natasha Greenblatt, Yolanda Bonnell, Qasim Khan, Anand Rajaram and Courtenay Stevens to volunteer on five different election campaigns across the province, and commissioned them to document their experiences. They campaigned for Liberal, NDP and Conservative candidates in rural, suburban and urban

ridings. In 2016 lead writer Natasha Greenblatt was awarded a two-week residency at the Banff Playwrights Colony to shape the written work and oral recordings into a first draft.

This theatre project is the second in a series of works about public engagement in Canada. The first work Common Boots created for the series was *The Public Servant*, a play developed from extensive interviews with federal employees.

A workshop production will be performed in Toronto in the spring of 2019.



#### The Devised Lab

The Devised Lab is a forum for emerging artists to explore the creative process that defines our practice. Founded in 2014 in honour of our 30th anniversary, the Devised Lab is a free weekly workshop for select members to investigate the essentials of play creation, facilitated by senior Common Boots artists. We dive into the creative cupboards of some of the greatest minds in the genre – Lecoq, Gaulier, Theatre Complicite, John Wright, Anne Bogart, Spy Monkey and Keith Johnstone.

In January 2018, we begin a new lab with the goal of creating a collection of short works about public life with public presentations along the way. The work will explore themes and ideas born from the issues of the day. The work will belong to their creators, to stand-alone or be the seed of a full-length piece or a larger collaborative project. Every couple of months we will check in on the work by opening the presentations to the public. The audience is an important part of our process. They become active witnesses to stories in the making, gems that could turn into mighty stories.



Serious Comedy: An Interactive Documentary You can listen to Serious Comedy at commonbootstheatre.ca/podcast

From Alexandra Watt Simpson, creator of Serious Comedy:

Serious Comedy is an interactive documentary that you, the viewer, gets to decide how you experience. You can start with the repertoire, or hear Jennifer's personal movement within the Toronto theatre scene. Over its 30 somewhat years, Common Boots Theatre/Theatre Columbus has created over 60 shows and we talked about all of them. Every month a new story or piece of repertoire will be released so keep checking

the website for updates. I hope you enjoy your exploration. I know I did. I had no idea what an impact this company and its collaborators had on Toronto theatre, a community I love and enjoy, but that I don't always understand. Some times it's helpful to know, that even those you admire most, might also have been a little lost in the beginning.



We are an artist-run, independent company in downtown Toronto. We produce large-scale outdoor winter theatre and collaboratively created comedies that explore political institutions, public vocations, and civic life.

We are the direct descendants of Theatre Columbus, whose co-founders, Leah Cherniak and Martha Ross, pioneered physical theatre and clown in Toronto, creating ground-breaking plays through a collaborative model that placed actors at the centre of the work.

Our creations uncover life on our common ground, places that we are connected to but do not visit, places that bind us together and have no roof. Places where individuals are cast as citizens, places where we fail, fall, and get up again.

Our work sits at the intersection of women, comedy, public space, and physical theatre. We champion anti-heroes, characters who are met in unexpected, forgotten spaces such as the public sector, the local riding office, or outdoors in the absurdity of winter.

The public has a complex relationship with women. We give them stage time to sort it out.

Our physical comedy grows out of the long lineage of commedia dell'arte and street performance, where scenes are founded on an encounter between an actor and a problem and sorted out in public.

Our annual activities include an outdoor winter production, the premier of a new work for the mainstage, the commissioning and development of up to three new works, all using collaborative models inspired by our foremothers.

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
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

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


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# OUTDOOR WINTER THEATRE WORD SEARCH

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#### **OUTDOOR WINTER THEATRE**

For 5 years, Common Boots Theatre has performed at the historic Evergreen Brick Works on the banks of the Don Valley. Our past shows include *The Story* by Martha Ross, *Weather the Weather* by Haley McGee, *The Dog and The Angel* by Martha Ross and *Tails from the City* by Marjorie Chan.

This year we bring *The Story* to a new location—Christie Pits Park, in one of Toronto's most vibrant and multicultural neighborhoods. The community is historically known to be a safe haven for newcomers as they transition to a new life in Canada.
